Alan & Sarah Wittmuss at 416 South University Street. This is an eclectic revival style home. Many updates have been made since its construction 1925. Come enjoy the historic notes of this South University Street home.

Linda Kogel at 405 South University Street. Linda has a beautiful Dutch colonial revival home on the tour. She has done many improvements to this home over the years.

Reverend Robert & Pauline Grossman at 818 Madison Street. Pauline is displaying her handmade beautiful quilts throughout the house.

Bill Hensley and Gloria Barnes at 102 Forest Avenue. This home is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. This home was built as the parsonage for the First Baptist Church in 1881. You will notice the original wood floors throughout the house, the chandeliers and glass door knobs. All of the rooms are large and make a comfortable home for living and entertaining.

We now have in our files some old ledgers that list the names of early residents in Vermillion and Clay County. We also received from local Real Estate Company some of the family photos and certificates of the family. These are added to our family files for genealogy purposes.

Maybe you know someone who is cleaning out a family home and there are old local newspapers, or a box of obituaries that have been saved from local papers, antique clothing, photos or other items that are being discarded. HISTORICAL RELATED ITEMS AVAILABLE

From the River Valleys to the Rising Bluff ... A Pictorial History of Vermillion, South Dakota 1859-2009

304 pages. This publication was sponsored by the Clay County Historical Society, Inc. for the Vermillion Sesquicentennial in 2009. The book conveys Vermillion's history through pictures and text.

History of Dakota Territory ... originally published in 1869 and 1870. 125 pages

A history of the Territory of Dakota tells about the Homestead land and the towns in the area. It describes the location of timber land, steam mills, water, and the climate and soil. It's a good source for those looking at the area.

Dakota's First Lynching ...

The booklet tells the lively story about James Hogan, a "desperado of the worst character". James Hogan's body was seen hanging from a roadside tree near the mouth of the Vermillion River on 26 February 1866. It's a mysterious little book to read.

A history of the Meckling and Gayville SD area makes this a great book for a historian. It also contains the history of many families that settled in Norway and Meckling townships.
