Notes From The AW Office

This has been a busy month at the office. The nice weather has brought many visitors and we have received some very nice items to add to our collections.

One of the important history items that we received was the Secretary's Book with the minutes from 1926-1946 for the Clay County Fair. We thank Carolyn DeRoos for thinking of us and getting these records to us. This is the first history of the fair that we have seen.

One of our Board members, Luann Ouellette, donated a great number of items including a beautiful quilt top made by her Grandmother and her sister in the 1930's. We contacted a lady in Vermillion that is a quilter and she took the top, assembled the quilt and machine quilted it. The Board of Directors decided that we would raffle the quilt off with the sale of tickets beginning on May 1 and the drawing will be held on Dec 1st. Tickets will be \$5.00 each or 3 for \$12.00. Winner does not have to be present at the drawing and the winner will be notified. Other items that Luann donated include:

3 piece child's silver plate flatware set. "Old Grape Pattern", circa 1900.
6 place settings of silver plate tableware, circa 1900's.
2 beautiful antique china serving bowls.
Large Victorian milk pitcher with floral decorations.
Shawnee pottery vase, pre WWII.
Hand painted tea pot trivet.
Hand painted serving plates.
2 1890's pattern glass kerosene lamps. One has handle.
Man's watch chain with a sterling silver cigar cutter on one end.
Several postcards and valentines.

Mr. Roger L. Dimick of Houston, TX sent us four record books of the Bruyer School dating between 1871 - 1938. Names and grades of children in school at that time are listed. A great historical source for families living in the Fairview Township area in the early days.

Gary Bottolfson gave us a framed copy of the Land Grant, Certificate # 399 that was given to Probate Ole Bottolfson for the City of Vermillion, dated March 2, 1867. The original copy of this piece of history now hangs in the Vermillion City Hall.

The Foundation at USD purchased a box of our Sesquicentennial books to give to former residents of Vermillion.

Our 4 dining room chairs sport new caned seats. A great job of caning by Dan Johnson.

We now have the early records of the Bluff View Cemetery stored at our office. We are reading the early minutes of the meetings that began in 1891. A group of men seemed to fail when getting the cemetery started so a group of five local women took over the management of the cemetery. They called themselves the "Vermillion Cemetery Improvement Association". They were successful in their endeavor and the minutes of their meetings are very entertaining. In 1905, they dropped "Improvement" from their title.

CCHS Awarded the Organizational Governor's Award

The Clay County Historical Society (CCHS) of Vermillion has been selected as the winner of the 2012 Organizational Governor's Award for History by a subcommittee of the South Dakota State Historical Society Board of Trustees.

The award will be received by Cleo Erickson (our local historian) on behalf of CCHS, April 14 at the Ramkota in Pierre. Cleo will also give a talk on the work of the CCHS in preserving state history in the Vermillion area.

Jim Wilson, a long time member of the CCHS, submitted the nomination in honor of the CCHS. He stated that the Society was deserving of the award for a long time. This is what he wrote and submitted to the SD State Historical Society:

The Clay County Historical Society was established in 1968 to preserve and publicize the history of Clay County and its inhabitants. The Society has an active membership that supports a variety of activities.

The Society is headquartered in the Austin Whittemore House. This house, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, was acquired by the Society shortly after it was established. The first floor spaces and the exterior have since been restored and the second floor spaces are used for storage and office space. The Society also provides a convenient meeting place for a variety of local organizations.

The Society maintains a large library of historic documents consisting of many family histories, county cemetery records, over 2,500 obituaries and extensive files of city, county, church and school histories. The Society also maintains an extensive photo archive. The Society and its executive director, Cleo Erickson are the central depository of Clay County history.

Regularly scheduled events include the following:

A June Ice Cream Social is one of the major fundraisers.

A Tour of Homes in early December that always concludes with refreshments at the appropriately decorated Austin Whittemore House.

Monthly meetings centered on a pot luck supper and a presentation on Local history.

A regularly published newsletter.

A weekly newspaper column devoted to excerpts from historic newspapers.

All staffing is done by volunteers.

The Society provides excellent cooperation with both the W. H. Over Museum and the Clay County Historic Preservation Commission. The Society has been heavily involved with the ongoing preservation/restoration of the historic replica first schoolhouse log cabin. The Society has also been intimately involved with maintaining the historic character of Historic Bluff View Cemetery.

The Clay County Historical Society has been responsible for the printing or reprinting of a series of books and documents that illustrate and promote the history of Clay County including:

From the River Valleys to the Rising Bluff. A Pictorial History of Vermillion, South Dakota, 1859-2009.

From the River Valleys to the Rising Bluff ... A Pictorial History of Vermillion, South Dakota 1859-2009

304 pages. This publication was sponsored by the Clay County Historical Society, Inc. for the Vermillion Sesquicentennial in 2009. The book conveys Vermillion's history through pictures and text.

History of Dakota Territory ... originally published in 1869 and 1870. 125 pages

A history of the Territory of Dakota tells about the Homestead land and the towns in the area. It describes the location of timber land, steam mills, water, and the climate and soil. It's a good source for those looking at the area.

Dakota's First Lynching ...

The booklet tells the lively story about James Hogan, a "desperado of the worst character". James Hogan's body was seen hanging from a roadside tree near the mouth of the Vermillion River on 26 February 1866. It's a mysterious little book to read.
