A Letter from Your President

Greetings from the President. It has been very busy at the Clay County Historical Society this year, with hard work from our dedicated CCHS Board members and donations of priceless items to the museum.

After many meetings, it has been decided to relocate the old log schoolhouse replica on the SW corner of the grounds of the Austin-Whittemore House. The Board has decided to salvage what they can (floor, furnishings, A-frame) and to start new with the rest (logs, shingles, concrete slab, etc). The anticipated cost is between \$15,000-\$25,000 and the CCHS has already started raising money for this. It is hoped to have everything completed by October, 2014, in time for the 150th Anniversary of formal education in South Dakota, the 75th Anniversary of the original replica, and the 100th Anniversary of Dakota Days. Donations for the fundraising campaign can be sent to the "Preserving the Past Project," c/o Clay County Historical Society, 15 Austin St., Vermillion, SD, 57069. An account for the project has been established at First Bank and Trust in Vermillion.

We served lunch to the Clay County Commissioners and Auditor on March 26th. It was so nice to meet our county officials and tell them about the CCHS and the many projects that we are involved with.

On Thursday, April 25th, at 6:05 pm the CCHS Board will host a potluck, followed by a program and our annual meeting with the election of new officers. The annual Ice Cream Social will be Thursday, June 20th from 5-7 pm at the Eagles Club. We will be serving taverns, homemade pies, cake, ice cream, chips, coffee and lemonade. A freewill donation will be accepted. The John McNeill will once again entertain us with their music.

We hope you will join us for our upcoming events. We appreciate your continued support of the Clay County Historical Society.

From the River Valleys to the Rising Bluff ... A Pictorial History of Vermillion, South Dakota 1859-2009

304 pages. This publication was sponsored by the Clay County Historical Society, Inc. for the Vermillion Sesquicentennial in 2009. The book conveys Vermillion's history through pictures and text.

History of Dakota Territory ... originally published in 1869 and 1870. 125 pages

A history of the Territory of Dakota tells about the Homestead land and the towns in the area. It describes the location of timber land, steam mills, water, and the climate and soil. It's a good source for those looking at the area.

The booklet tells the lively story about James Hogan, a "desperado of the worst character". James Hogan's body was seen hanging from a roadside tree near the mouth of the Vermillion River on 26 February 1866. It's a mysterious little book to read.
